The Library has support facilities for effective functioning and developing for benefit of students and staff. It has internet facility with 100 mbps broadband capacities with Wi-Fi on campus. It also has reprographic facilities for immediate Xeroxing of reading material. It has advance computer systems with LAN connectivity for benefit of students to browse journals on en-LIST, DELNET connectivity for removal any deficiency in the Library a suggestion box is provided to making suggestions about deficiencies and its removal. Library also provides question paper sets of earlier examination for understanding the pattern of examination on their Identity cards. Library also issues additional books to the students on demand for their ready references to studies. New arrivals in the Library are immediately exposed to the students and faculties by displaying them book jackets and racks. Librarian is also authorizing to order of the books of the students interest. Library is being atomized with SOUL Software for encouraging early deliver system of books.
