THE I

THE INSTITUTION

Dnyanopasak Shikshan Mandal, a registered society, opened its College of Arts, Commerce and Science, at Parbhani in 1984 with the sole aim of offering higher education and provide educational facilities in this educationally backward region. Taking into account the needs of the youth in the region, new courses of study have been started for the first time in the district by the college. The College devotes continuously for the two basic tenets of higher education in the country namely academic development and discipline among the students. The Institution, from the day of its inception, attracted rural youth whose guest for learning is being properly satisfied by paying individual attention and by directing his/her energies to creative and constructive activities. University Grants Commission, New Delhi has adjudicated this college as COLLEGE WITH POTENTIAL FOR EXCELLENCE during Xth plan period. Recently, the college is sanctioned 2.00 crore rupees fund by RUSA. The aim of the Institution also includes the building up of a morally sound and socially vigorous community of learners who, in future, will bear the responsibilities in the fast growing complex society. In fact the institution has trained the incumbent in such a manner to attain all pervasive prosperity.

The institution, started with meager 9 teachers and 51 students, has grown by leaps and bounds with a strength of 2511 students and 132 teachers in 2018-2019. Likewise the college has now grown into a premier institution of higher learning, offering Under-graduate and Post-graduate courses in various disciplines under the faculties of Arts, Commerce and Science. The strength of PG students is 886 and the college has well equipped laboratories housed in a three storey building with all facilities like internet, wi-fi campus and airconditioningand digital classes.

The Library has more than 71120 books for circulation and subscribes to about 1140 National and International journals including Indian Science Abstracts, Indian Journal of Chemistry, Indian Journal of Pure & Applied Physics, Indian Journal of Experimental Biology, Journal of Astrophysics & Astronomy, Journal of Earth System Science, Journal of Accounting & Finance, International Journal of Comp. Science & Info. Technology, International Journal of Mathematics & Computer, International Journal of Earth Science, Engineering and Literature.

The faculty is constantly engaged in research, and the development

experimenting new teaching methods. Most of the faculty members acquired and continued research degrees and diplomas and have attended orientation/refresher programs at different places in the Country.

- o1) The students of the college secured high percentage of marks in the University examinations and maintained their position in the University too where they pursue their higher studies. The college has been represented on various occasions at the University, national level competitions in sports and cultural activities where they won prizes.
- The staff members of the College, during the past ten years, completed their research and were awarded Ph.D. and M.Phil. degrees. Some of the faculty members have actively engaged themselves in completing their doctoral research work while others were being motivated to undertake various research schemes. The faculty members are given freedom to introduce innovative methods of teaching to improve the academic standard of the students. The teachers are deputed to attain refresher courses and training programs organized by the National Agencies like UGC. The Management of the College is ever eager to consider the views and wishes of the teachers and students for the enhancement of academic standards.
- o3) Students and teachers are selected on the basis of merit duly taking into consideration, the reservation policies in effect, in the state. The teachers are selected by a committee comprising the President, Management Nominee, Principal, University Nominee, Govt. Nominee and three Subject Experts. Adequate provision is made to admit students from backward communities and economically weaker sections of the society.
- o4) The college is housed in a huge three storey structure raised on its own land in the heart of the city. Laboratories are fully developed with modern equipment and all basic needs are provided. The library is computerized and manned by qualified staff with high qualifications and training.
- o5) The management comprises a small body of members with the Principal as the Secretary who administers the college. The Principal guides the academic wing of the college and implements the policy decisions of the Management.

CBCS PATTERN

The criterion for Admission to PG: The candidates who have passed at the bachelor's degree with respective subject (optional) with atleast 24 credits in the CGPA/CBCS pattern of this university or the candidates from other universities with 24 credits in the specific subject. Each P.G. course is of a four semester duration. Each of the semester normally contains four papers. In science courses, there are two practical papers and optional are available for the last semester courses. The Project work & seminars are included in syllabus.

PGDMM Course: It is a Postgraduate Diploma in Marketing Management. This PG Diploma has annual examination pattern. Any graduate is eligible for admission to the course. The Project work is compulsory for the diploma.

M.A.: In Arts (M.A.) each semester has four theory papers (4 credits for each paper). Total credits are 16 of 400 marks and the Master Degree in Arts is of 68 credits of 1600 marks including project work of 100 marks and so the degree consists of 1700 marks.

M.Com.: In Commerce (M.Com.) each semester has 4 theory papers (4 credits for each paper). Total credits are 16 of 400 marks resulting in total M.Com. degree of 64 credits of 1600 marks (M.Com. F.Y. and S.Y.) including Project Work.

M.Sc. Science: In Science each semester has 4 theory papers + 2 practical papers and 1 seminar of 25 credits of 625 marks, resulting into total Master degree of 100 credits of 2500 marks.

University has decided and finalized the pattern of CBCS for PG to be implemented form academic year 2014-15 and the pattern is as follows

Lateral and vertical mobility within and across programmes and courses At present the lateral mobility is not permitted for any course offered by the college.

Full vertical mobility is available for BA and BCA since any +2 pass student can be admitted to these courses. It is partially available for B.Com. as +2 pass (Science and commerce stream) students can be admitted to these courses.

M.A. (English) also has full vertical mobility as any graduate with English for four credits (200 marks) is eliqible to take admission

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

Admission to the above courses will be strictly on competitive merit. Admission procedure will be completed as per rules and regulations of Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded within stipulated period.

ELIGIBILITY:

B.A. and B.Sc. Graduates are eligible to seek admission respectively to any of the M.A/M.Sc. courses listed above by satisfying the following conditions.

- o1) Candidate must have studied the concerned subject at qualifying examination as an optional subject. B.Com. students can appear for M.A. Economics as well as M.A. English.
- o2) The candidates of Arts, Commerce and Science faculty who have passed their graduation with particular second language or compulsory language will be eligible for admission to Postgraduate courses in that particular subject.
- o3) For admission to M.Sc. Computer Science, Science graduates are eligible. The candidates who have passed B.C.A., B.Sc. Computer Science (B.C.S.), any graduate (10+2+3) with PGDCA/ADCSSAA/ "A" level conducted by Department of Electronics and all Engineering graduates shall be permitted to take admission to M.Sc.Comp. Science
- o4) For admission to Post-graduate Courses original documents along with self attested copies of Marks-memos of 1st, 2nd and 3rd year of Under-graduate degree level be attached.
- Original Migration Certificate and Transfer Certificate along with two self attested Xerox copies are required if candidate has migrated from the University within Maharashtra or outside Maharashtra.



ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- o6) If Migration Certificate of a student is not readily available his / her eligibility form along with necessary certificates be forwarded before 31st December of every year. Rs. 500/- shall be charged as a fine for late submission of Migration Certificate after the stipulated date.
- o7) The candidate admitted in Post-graduate course should submit original documents along with eligibility form if he/she fails to submit before the end of the first term, Rs. 500/- shall be charged as penalty.
- o8) Graduate of this University seeking admission to Postgraduate course for the same faculty in this University area requires fresh eligibility number.
- og) If the Student, who has obtained eligibility for admission to a particular stream, wants to change the faculty he/she will have to obtain fresh eligibility accordingly.
- 10) In case it is observed (particularly in case of girl student) that there is a change in the name, surname in passing certificate/ degree certificate and in the eligibility application form, the form must be enclosed with the necessary documents as a proof for change in the name i.e. copy of Govt. Gazette/ Marriage registration certificate/ Affidavit submitted by candidate before the judicial magistrate. (The eligibility shall not be granted in absence of such supporting documents mentioned above.)
- candidate from other Universities who has passed the first year of the Post-graduate examination will not be eligible for admission in the second year course of this University or affiliated colleges.

ADMISSION FEES:

Students should pay the tuition fees as prescribed by the University and College.

Note:

- o1) Students should pay the tuition fees as prescribed by the University and College.
- o2) Candidate should bring his/her original documents for verification on the day of admission.
- o3) No admission would be made after the closing date of the admission procedure.
- o4) Incomplete admission forms will be cancelled.
- o5) All necessary documents should be attached with the admission form. Candidates will not be allowed to attach the documents after the stipulated period.

ELIGIBILITY FEES:

- a) The cost of the eligibility form is Rs.10/-.
- b) The eligibility fees for the student within the Marathwada region is Rs.100/-.
- c) The eligibility fees for the student outside the Marathwada region but within the State of Maharashtra is Rs. 200/-.
- d) The eligibility fees for the student migrating from outside the Maharashtra State is Rs. 500/-.
- e) The eligibility fees for the student for Nationality of another country (foreign Nationality) is 300 American Dollars even if he/she migrates from Indian Universities and aboard Universities.
